## The Wonky Garden – Our Story

We are based at Ditton Community Centre, Widnes, Halton. Together with volunteers, we have created and nurture therapy, children's and allotment gardens supporting mother nature throughout the seasons.



All of our practices are 100% chemical free and focus on minimising our carbon impact.

We support physical and mental health, enhancing life skills and educating about food and the natural environment, garden maintenance and DIY skills. Our plants and cut flowers are used for therapy and gifting to individuals and local groups and the majority of our edibles are gifted to a local causes.

Our journey started in February 2018 when we were invited to take over an allotment behind a local community centre by Halton Borough Council (HBC).

We wanted to extend our capabilities to become more self sufficient with growing our own plants, grow more to gift and to create a Community Network Group. Halton Borough Council were, once again, really accommodating and we have finally completed our infrastructure!

- Gifting (one of our biggest community engagement impacts):
  - Food to our local foodbank and social supermarket.
  - Edible, perennial and cut flower plants to our Community Growing Network (14 groups).
  - Cut flowers and mini plants to those in need of a pick-me-up.

### **Volunteer Engagement**

- Balance enthusiasm with what can reasonably and joyfully be achieved.
- Always, always include a chatty break, brew and snack.
- Word of mouth has been the most powerful way to attract volunteers (especially through gifting).
- Always ask potential volunteers what they want to do and why us.
- Keep the dialogue going, encourage input and experimentation.
- Saying yes straight away can have its downfalls, always 'try before you buy'. Trial periods are essential; team fit, personal expectations, safety.
- Remember. volunteers are just that they come and go and are with us to have a better day - they sign for themselves, not necessarily to mentor or assist others.
- If someone has additional needs insist on a mentor until everyone is comfortable that it is the right environment and that they will be safe.
